REPRESENTATIVE MATTERS

- *Caterpillar Inc., et al. v. California Air Resources Board*. As lead trial counsel, won an unprecedented trial verdict in this case of first impression defended by the state Attorney General's Office. The court invalidated an ARB regulation, finding that the regulation unconstitutionally impaired contracts and amounted to an illegal recall. Examined top government officials at trial and in deposition. (August 2006.).
- *Counsel to Unocal—National Environmental Docket*. Worked as part of a nationwide Howrey team to manage a national environmental litigation docket. Coordinated defense of multiple Louisiana oilfield contamination claims brought in state and federal courts. Developed and utilized cutting-edge case management and litigation budgeting tools. - *United States v. Caterpillar, Inc.* As counsel to Caterpillar in a landmark EPA, DOJ and California investigation of heavy-duty diesel engine industry mobile source emissions, developed arguments regarding complex issues of first impression under the Clean Air Act; negotiated settlement provisions; worked with engineers and emission modeling experts; and coordinated joint defense efforts.
- *Adhesives Research, Inc. v. American Inks & Coatings Corp.* Served as litigation counsel to 17 settling Potentially Responsible Parties (PRPs). Defended a private cost recovery action by 136 settling PRPs against nonsettling PRPs, established liability of third-party waste broker and coordinated joint defense efforts.

The suit ended on the eve of a preliminary injunction hearing after the citizens unsuccessfully sought to withdraw their own preliminary injunction motion.
- *U.S. v. Marine Shale Processors.* Defended a multimedia environmental enforcement action (including a jury trial) brought by the Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of Justice. Deposed state and federal regulators; second-chaired bench trials concerning alleged regulatory violations; and participated in three appeals to the US Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit.
- *eDiscovery Engagement (Confidential).* Worked with in-house legal and IT team of Fortune 50 company to develop and deploy comprehensive eDiscovery response program.
